Or IELTS with minimum level of 6.5
Or ITACE with minimum level of B2

University Degree:

- Holding a University Master's in Economics, Business, or Management
- or holding a University Master's and having obtained in her/his university curriculum 50 credits in economics, business, or management and 10 credits in law
- or holding a relevant University Master's. In this case, students will have to follow an additional programme of up to 15 credits in economics and management that will be added to the standard programme of Advanced Master in European Business & Economic Policy

Application deadlines:

International student applications can now be submitted.

- Non-European students have until 31 March to apply online
- EU students until 13 September.
